Sermon: The Christians self image? The image of God!

We hear so much about self esteem these days. But is the term "self esteem" a Christian concept? For Christians, the term "self image" is perhaps a better word. Our self image should be shaped by what God has to say about us. We will explore the tension between being lost sinners, yet redeemed in Christ. Which should get the most focus?

James 14:6 Jesus said to him, "I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Me."

Scripture Reading: Exodus 11 and 12

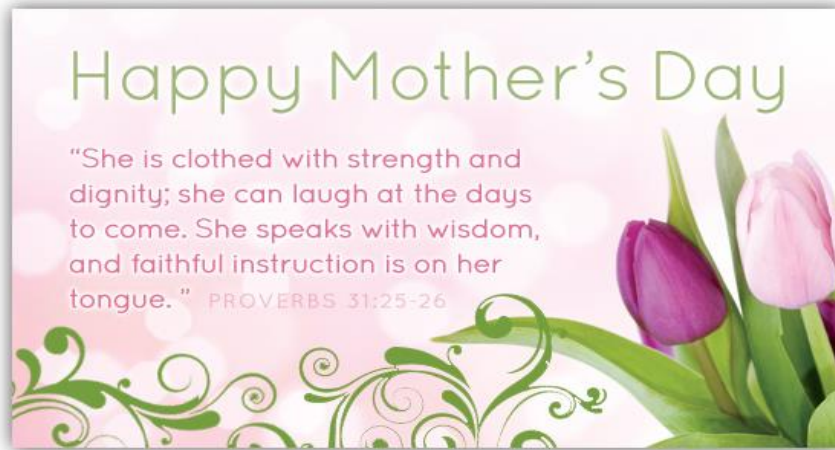
Doors or gates are something through which we go through each day. From one room to another, from one place to another, from one world to another ... A bride walks through the heavy church doors into a new world. Through a cemetery's gate, you enter another world ... Easter is a festival with a gate, a blood gate. Israel had to walk through that gate. With the tenth plague, God hits all the firstborn in Egypt with death.

Israel is under the same judgment and punishment of God because Israel is the firstborn (Ex 4 22). Why? We see it in the feast of passing, Easter. Israel must stay behind the door while the Death Angel is walking. Israel is slave made by the godless Pharaoh, symbolically, Egypt is the prison of sin, Israel is there as a prison of sin! Israel cannot just go away, they have to go through the gate, the Blood Gate! Israel does not deserve Freedom, it is God's.

Now it's not hard to draw the line to us. Christ is our Passover to God who suffered and died for us. It means peace with God, free from the power of sin. Without merit, but by grace alone. Israel may now pass through the Blood Gate, from slaves to free people, from a land devastated and sown from the smells of death, sin and disobedience to a new land, a land of milk and honey ... of one World to another world. Jesus is the door, the gate to the Father ...

The Ladies continue to keep the Transit House in good order and work very hard when there are back to back groups. We need a replacement washing machine for the Transit House, and we are also looking at new solar batteries for the office/director's house/leaf house as the ones that are on providing power (or not!) now keep trying to die.

WORD MINISTRY

Eric & Jemima spent a week in Australia at the Pastor's Conference, then a week over Easter in their home village on Malaita where Eric ministered at their Easter program (6 sermons over 5 days!). The Bible study series, 'Raising a Christian family in today's world' went into recess over Easter, but has commenced again. With 300-400 attendees sitting under Eric's teaching, the potential impact is great. Jemima also contracted malaria but is now recovering and getting better each day.

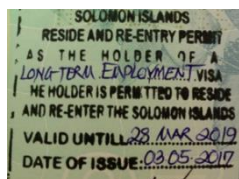
DEED MINISTRY

It's been a busy month for Transit bookings, with teams from NZ and Australia passing through, three groups from Internal Revenue Department (local) for team building, and various church groups for Easter and other events. Also, a truckload of goods was taken to the wharf for shipping to One Pusu Bible College.

Ron and Tanya are at present waiting in Brisbane for their work permits and visas to be approved. At the time of writing this, the work permits should be approved by the end of this week, with the long-term employment visas hopefully approved by the end of next week. Then it's WELCOME TO RON AND TANYA!! This means that the SWIM base will have full staff for the first time in a little while.

DIRECTORS

For our first Easter in the Solomon Islands we attended a dawn service at the American war memorial with the church we attend here (Kukum Campus Church). It was a 'heavenly setting' located high on a ridge overlooking Honiara and out to Iron Bottom Sound. A breath taking way to celebrate the resurrection of our LORD and Saviour Jesus Christ. Easter is a big deal over here with most of the country attending church on Thursday night (Good Friday eve) through till Monday morning.



Our visas are finally approved and have the required stamp! We thank God for the quickness of it all, when all said and done, from the time we had the required paper-work put in, it was only three weeks. The hold-ups normally come when you are only told one week at a time that you need another form, or another piece of information before the forms can all be lodged. Both of us have been a bit sick, Scott with some random bug trying to imitate mild malaria, but testing negative to both malaria and

dengue. Whereas Heather tested positive to FP malaria and had to take two courses of medication to kick it out! YUK!
